



This bulletin was produced monthly for over 50 years and had changed very little in an attempt to honour the efforts of those who came before.

In previous years, when we had lots of events, many committee chairs as well as a Ladies Auxiliary and Club 55, there were a number of pages filled by others. The bulletin was 20 pages with about 4 being pretty static for the year, 5 or 6 being filled with committee and event information and another 2 or 3 with interesting articles and opinions from members.
